Dear Drs. Crispo and Ansell,

Dominic Giroux, President of Laurentian University, asked me to reply to your request following the decision of the University's Property Development and Planning Committee (PDPC) not to convey land to you that is owned by the University and on which your residential use encroaches.

Matters involving the University's property are brought before its Board of Governors only on recommendation of the PDPC. As the matter of sale of land to you did not survive the Committee, it will not be considered by the Board. The Board does not have a process by which individuals can appear before it, so I am afraid a deputation is not possible.

The PDPC decided not to support the conveyance of the property to you as it does not support the solution of encroachments in this manner. The Committee debated the matter and provided direction to Administration that it not propose the sale of land as a solution to encroachment as a general rule.

I understand you are disappointed with the University's decision. If you would like to write to the PDPC, we will ensure your letter is shared with the Committee at its next meeting, scheduled for March 29, 2017.
